Poster data must be pre-mounted on poster board and easel ready (poster board is usually foam or heavy duty cardboard – easily purchased in any art supply store or ordered through SciQuest from W.B. Mason. Example: Trifold project board, 36x48". Free-standing easels (no poster boards attached) will be available for your poster display. Largest poster size recommended is 3'x4'.
